

OPERATION ART

Creative Forces National Community Convening:

Operation ART Program Coordinator Isabella Brezenski was able to attend the Creative Forces National Community Convening January 29-30, 2023, in Washington, DC.

The Creative Forces: NEA Military Healing Arts Network is an initiative by the National Endowment of the Arts that started in 2011 at the National Intrepid Center of Excellence (NICoE) Walter Reed Bethesda and expanded into a network of clinical creative arts therapists at VA and DOD sites nationwide. In 2017, the network grew to include community arts engagement sites near the VA and DOD sites where clinical arts programs existed. The network allowed veterans to access community arts programming specifically for military personnel in addition to dance/movement, art, and music therapies provided by creative arts therapists.

In 2021 and 2022, in connection with the Creative Forces community arts network, The Joel Fund conducted a virtual Writing class at **Walter Reed Military Hospital** with **Operation ART Writing Instructor**, **June Guralnick**, for veterans and hospital staff.

The National Convening was a chance for the clinical and community arts networks to come together to learn, connect, and network. For some, this was the first time meeting fellow organizations in person! Isabella attended this convening in person and connected with military arts organizations near and far. Her time was filled with discussions surrounding military competency, brand storytelling, data collection, and measuring success.



Women-Only Classes:

Operation ART started 2023 with a brand new class for women only! The **Fiber Arts Sampler for Women** class began to provide female veterans with a safe space to create. Isabella received feedback from a few female veterans who did not feel comfortable in some of our classes because they were the only woman in a classroom full of men.

A women-only class taught by a female veteran was created to serve this group of students best. The instructor for this class, **Grace McFetters Caldwell**, is an Army veteran working in fiber arts for many years.

The Accessible Weaving for Women started in March, and we plan on offering a women-only class in future sessions to provide the option for our female veterans.

Handbuilding Pottery Class for People with Visual Impairments:

This Spring, The Joel Fund introduced a **Handbuliding Pottery Class for People with Visual Impairments**. The **NC Arts Council** supports this class after The Joel Fund received a grant to attend the LEAD Conference in August and establish an accessibility initiative. Striving to bring more accessible classes to all veterans in our community, Isabella connected with **VA Recreational Therapist Demetris McLeod** to plan an Operation ART class for veterans with visual impairments. Students will handbuild and glaze multiple ceramic pieces over this five-week class.

C3 Church Serve Team Donation:

TJF's Executive Director Brooke Dickhart and Operation Furnish Program Coordinator Emily Karrick visited C3 Church of Clayton to receive a generous donation for veterans and their families. C3's Serve Team gathered Forty-four laundry baskets filled with items such as non-perishable food, paper towels, toilet paper, toothbrushes, kitchen dishes, can openers, notebooks, pencils, and tissues. Their generous donation also includes gift cards to Food Lion, Target, and Walmart. C3's generosity will go a long way in serving veterans and their families through our Operation Furnish Program. As of March 27, 2023, we have served nine households this year.

Women's MilVet Summit host, **NCDMVA**, invited The Joel Fund to share our services and conduct a breakout session during the summit on March 7th, 2023. This event provided women veterans, caregivers, and military spouses with resources and information on benefits, employment tips, mindfulness, and art expression. **The Joel Fund Operation ART Instructor, Grace McFetters Caldwell**, taught participants a small needle felting project they could take home. It was a fantastic event, and seeing women veterans getting the support they needed was beautiful. TJF was honored to present to this group.





2023 Veteran Resource Fair and Stand Down in Durham:

TJF is gearing up for the annual **Veteran Resource Fair and Stand Down in Durham on September 16, 2023**. Sixty-eight local resource providers registered as vendors last year and over 300 people were in attendance. Vendors consisted of community partners offering services such as housing, employment, education, hygiene, mental health services, a dental bus, legal aid expunction clinic, COVID-booster shots, a mobile shower unit, and homeless kits. We are well ahead of the curve this year in terms of planning and look forward to continuing to grow this event every year.
